Disaster Impact and Needs Reporting Form

Instructions

This is not a data collection or assessment form: it should only be used to record data that has been collected using appropriate assessment tools. The form has 3 parts: demographic information, impact and needs. The report should be used for all kinds of disasters, regardless of magnitude or number of affected households/people. When completing the report, ensure that all sections are completed: where impact is not observed, indicate as 'no any damage,' denoted by NAD. **Incomplete reports will be sent back**, which might delay provision of relief assistance and/or any other required action by government and other stakeholders. The report form should cover a single disaster event (resulting from the same hazard and occurring within the same time) and should be accompanied by a cover letter, dully signed by an appropriate authority.

All HH items were affected. ✓ 2 Houses caught fire which destroyed everything in Green Corner Ward. Possible cause is candle fire. The victims are internally displaced and accommodated by relatives/neighbours. ✓ 16 houses were soaked under flooded water from the Kachere SDA tributary channel and Nasolo River. Some of HH items were spoiled. ✓ About 101 houses had their roofs partly damaged in Makata and Gamulani Wards. Some of their HH items were spoiled.

<p>Logistics (indicate extent of damage to roads, bridges, communication facilities, accessibility of area)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Kachere SDA road culvert blocked by waste which the community carelessly dispose and gets carried by storm water ✓ Majiga Bridge culvert in Gamulani blocked by waste which the community carelessly dispose and gets carried by storm water ✓ Most drainage channels blocked due to waste accumulation
<p>Water and Sanitation (indicate damage to water points, sanitation facilities and the general sanitation situation)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The floods resulted into breaking of water pipes that supply water to some quarters within the community. Therefore, at some point, within the area should have experienced some intermittent supply of piped water. ✓ The flood have also ended up filling up some pit-latrines, thereby overflowing in some places posing a great threat of water borne diseases. ✓ Wastes that were disposed of in most community spaces were washed to unintended points thereby compromising sanitation and hygiene

<p>Education (indicate names and number of schools affected, number of learners and teachers affected per school, whether classrooms are being used as shelter sites)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Ndirande Primary School has part of its roofs affected ✓ Makata primary school was also affected by strong wind that was accompanied some rains ✓ The roof of one school blocks, head teacher's house and a store room was completely blown off and damaged by ✓ 240 learners, thus 108 males and 132 females that belong to standard 1 and 5 do not have learning space representing 21% from a total of 1628 learners. ✓ No learner got injured nor dead. ✓ 4 teachers have been affected ✓ One side of the fence (about 5 panels) got collapsed ✓ Learning materials in the affected HH were spoiled, thereby affecting the school going ✓ Learners who lost livelihood provision including dwelling shelter seldom go school

<p>Livelihoods (indicate if markets have been affected, coping mechanisms people are using, indicate if any household items other than food have been damaged/lost)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Household items like; Cell phone, kitchen utensils and clothes, entertainment units have been washed away by floods for the HH that were badly affected by flood waters and fire. ✓ Almost every woody and plastic household items for two families have been damaged by fire in Green-corner Ward. ✓ 19 businesses in all wards were affected. Some businesses are being conducted close to Nasolo stream which was overfilled with water and solid waste including sand and silt.

The injured persons received some medical assistance.
<p>Environment (indicate any major impact on the environment)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The flooding in Nasolo river and other parts have been exacerbated by unnecessary dumping of garbage into the river and other stream which are reducing the volume of the river/streams. ✓ Some waste left in open spaces also got eroded to the water channels thereby increasing load and possible blockage of the river.
